JD SALAZAR REPOSITIONS CHAMPION REALTY ADVISORS WITH NEW MISSION

New Venture Seeks Investment Opportunities in Transportation and Outdoor Storage Properties on Behalf of Family Offices and HNWI's

IOV’s focus is on acquiring transportation related properties and outdoor storage properties around the country, and by May 2018 had purchased nine properties in Atlanta, Chicago, Ft. Worth, Houston and Denver.

Salazar transitioned out of IOV in order to work on growing his family’s real estate holdings through joint ventures and partnerships with family offices and high net worth individuals.
